A BILL

To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require institutions of higher education to disclose hazing incidents, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Stop Campus Hazing
5	Act".
6	SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF HAZING INCIDENTS IN ANNUAL SE-
7	CURITY REPORTS.
8	(a) Statistics on Hazing Incidents.—
9	(1) In General.—Section $485(f)(1)(F)$ of the
10	Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.
11	1092(f)(1)(F)) is amended—
12	(A) in clause (i)(IX), by striking "and"
13	after the semicolon;
14	(B) in clause (ii), by striking "and" after
15	$the \ semicolon;$
16	(C) in clause (iii), by striking the period at
17	the end and inserting "; and"; and
18	(D) by adding at the end the following:
19	"(iv) of hazing incidents that were re-
20	ported to campus security authorities or
21	local police agencies.".
22	(2) Compilation of hazing incidents.—Sec-
23	tion 485(f)(7) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
24	(20 U.S.C. $1092(f)(7)$) is amended by inserting after
25	the second sentence the following: "For hazing inci-

1	dents referred to in clause (iv) of paragraph (1)(F),
2	such statistics shall be compiled per each single haz-
3	ing incident and in accordance with the definition of
4	the term 'hazing' in paragraph (6)(A)(vi), and if the
5	same person or persons commit more than one hazing
6	act, and the time and place intervals separating each
7	such act are insignificant, such acts shall be reported
8	as a single hazing incident.".
9	(3) Beginning of compilation of hazing sta-
10	TISTICS.—Not later than January 1 of the first year
11	after the date of enactment of this Act, each eligible
12	institution participating in any program under title
13	IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.
14	1070 et seq.), other than a foreign institution of high-
15	er education, shall begin to collect statistics on hazing
16	incidents for the purpose of complying with clause
17	(iv) of section $485(f)(1)(F)$ of such Act, as added by
18	paragraph (1) of this subsection.
19	(4) Definition of Hazing.—Section
20	485(f)(6)(A) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
21	$U.S.C.\ 1092(f)(6)(A))$ is amended by adding at the
22	end the following:
23	"(vi) The term 'hazing', for purposes of reporting
24	statistics on hazing incidents under paragraph
25	(1)(F)(iv), means any intentional, knowing, or reck-

1	less act committed by a person (whether individually
2	or in concert with other persons) against another per-
3	son or persons regardless of the willingness of such
4	other person or persons to participate, that—
5	"(I) is committed in the course of an initi-
6	ation into, an affiliation with, or the mainte-
7	nance of membership in, a student organization;
8	and
9	"(II) causes or creates a risk, above the rea-
10	sonable risk encountered in the course of partici-
11	pation in the institution of higher education or
12	the organization (such as the physical prepara-
13	tion necessary for participation in an athletic
14	team), of physical or psychological injury in-
15	cluding—
16	"(aa) whipping, beating, striking, elec-
17	tronic shocking, placing of a harmful sub-
18	stance on someone's body, or similar activ-
19	ity;
20	"(bb) causing, coercing, or otherwise
21	inducing sleep deprivation, exposure to the
22	elements, confinement in a small space, ex-
23	treme calisthenics, or other similar activity;

1	"(cc) causing, coercing, or otherwise
2	inducing another person to consume food,
3	liquid, alcohol, drugs, or other substances;
4	"(dd) causing, coercing, or otherwise
5	inducing another person to perform sexual
6	acts;
7	"(ee) any activity that places another
8	person in reasonable fear of bodily harm
9	through the use of threatening words or con-
10	duct;
11	"(ff) any activity against another per-
12	son that includes a criminal violation of
13	local, State, Tribal, or Federal law; and
14	"(gg) any activity that induces, causes,
15	or requires another person to perform a
16	duty or task that involves a criminal viola-
17	tion of local, State, Tribal, or Federal
18	law.".
19	(5) Definition of student organization.—
20	Section 485(f)(6)(A) of the Higher Education Act of
21	1965 (20 U.S.C. 1092(f)(6)(A)) is further amended by
22	adding at the end the following:
23	"(vii) The term 'student organization', for pur-
24	poses of reporting under paragraph $(1)(F)(iv)$ and
25	paragraph (9)(A), means an organization at an insti-

1	tution of higher education (such as a club, society, as-
2	sociation, varsity or junior varsity athletic team, club
3	sports team, fraternity, sorority, band, or student gov-
4	ernment) in which two or more of the members are
5	students enrolled at the institution of higher edu-
6	cation, whether or not the organization is established
7	or recognized by the institution.".
8	(b) Statement of Policy and Prevention Pro-
9	GRAM ON HAZING.—Section 485(f)(1) of the Higher Edu-
10	cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1092(f)(1)) is amended by
11	$inserting \ after \ subparagraph \ (J) \ the \ following:$
12	"(K) A statement of current policies relating to
13	hazing (as defined by the institution), how to report
14	incidents of such hazing, and the process used to in-
15	vestigate such incidents of hazing, and information
16	on applicable local, State, and Tribal laws on hazing
17	(as defined by such local, State, and Tribal laws).
18	"(L) A statement of policy regarding prevention
19	and awareness programs related to hazing (as defined
20	by the institution) that includes a description of re-
21	search-informed campus-wide prevention programs
22	designed to reach students, staff, and faculty, which
23	includes—
24	"(i) the information referred to in subpara-
25	graph (K); and

1	"(ii) primary prevention strategies intended
2	to stop hazing before hazing occurs, which may
3	include skill building for bystander intervention,
4	information about ethical leadership, and the
5	promotion of strategies for building group cohe-
6	sion without hazing.".
7	(c) Effective Date; Application.—The amend-
8	ments made by this section shall—
9	(1) take effect on the date that is 6 months after
10	the date of enactment of this Act; and
11	(2) apply with respect to the annual security re-
12	port required under section 485(f)(1) of the Higher
13	Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1092(f)(1)) for the
14	calendar year that is 2 years after such date of enact-
15	ment, including any data collected on or after such
16	effective date, and any subsequent report required
17	under such section.
18	SEC. 3. CAMPUS HAZING TRANSPARENCY REPORT.
19	Section 485(f) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
20	(20 U.S.C. 1092(f)) is further amended—
21	(1) by redesignating paragraphs (9) through (18)
22	as paragraphs (10) through (19), respectively; and
23	(2) by inserting after paragraph (8) the fol-
24	lowing:

1	"(9)(A) Each institution participating in any pro-
2	gram under this title, other than a foreign institution of
3	higher education, shall develop, in accordance with the in-
4	stitution's statement of policy relating to hazing under
5	paragraph (1)(K), a report (which shall be referred to as
6	the 'Campus Hazing Transparency Report') summarizing
7	findings concerning any student organization (except that
8	this shall only apply to student organizations that are es-
9	tablished or recognized by the institution) found to be in
10	violation of an institution's standards of conduct relating
11	to hazing, as defined by the institution, (hereinafter referred
12	to in this paragraph as a 'hazing violation') that requires
13	the institution to—
14	"(i) beginning July 1, 2025, collect information
15	with respect to hazing incidents at the institution;
16	"(ii) not later than 12 months after the date of
17	the enactment of the Stop Campus Hazing Act, make
18	the Campus Hazing Transparency Report publicly
19	available on the public website of the institution; and
20	"(iii) not less frequently than 2 times each year,
21	update the Campus Hazing Transparency Report to
22	include, for the period beginning on the date on which
23	the Report was last published and ending on the date
24	on which such update is submitted, each incident in-
25	volving a student organization for which a finding of

1	responsibility is issued relating to a hazing violation,
2	including—
3	"(I) the name of such student organization;
4	"(II) a general description of the violation
5	that resulted in a finding of responsibility, in-
6	cluding whether the violation involved the abuse
7	or illegal use of alcohol or drugs, the findings of
8	the institution, and any sanctions placed on the
9	student organization by the institution, as appli-
10	cable; and
11	"(III) the dates on which—
12	"(aa) the incident was alleged to have
13	occurred;
14	"(bb) the investigation into the inci-
15	dent was initiated;
16	"(cc) the investigation ended with a
17	finding that a hazing violation occurred;
18	and
19	"(dd) the institution provided notice to
20	the student organization that the incident
21	resulted in a hazing violation.
22	"(B) The Campus Hazing Transparency Report may
23	include—
24	"(i) to satisfy the requirements of this para-
25	graph, information that—

1	"(I) is included as part of a report pub-
2	lished by the institution; and
3	"(II) meets the requirements of the Campus
4	Hazing Transparency Report; and
5	"(ii) any additional information—
6	"(I) determined by the institution to be nec-
7	essary; or
8	"(II) reported as required by State law.
9	"(C) The Campus Hazing Transparency Report shall
10	not include any personally identifiable information, includ-
11	ing any information that would reveal personally identifi-
12	able information, about any individual student in accord-
13	ance with section 444 of the General Education Provisions
14	Act (commonly known as the Family Educational Rights
15	and Privacy Act of 1974').
16	"(D) The institution shall publish, in a prominent lo-
17	cation on the public website of the institution, the Campus
18	Hazing Transparency Report, including—
19	"(i) a statement notifying the public of the an-
20	nual availability of statistics on hazing pursuant to
21	the report required under paragraph $(1)(F)$, includ-
22	ing a link to such report;
23	"(ii) information about the institution's policies
24	relating to hazing under paragraph (1)(K) and appli-
25	cable local, State, and Tribal laws on hazing; and

1	"(iii) the information included in each update
2	required under subparagraph (A)(iii), which shall be
3	maintained for a period of 5 calendar years from the
4	date of publication of such update.
5	"(E) The institution may include, as part of the publi-
6	cation of the Campus Hazing Transparency Report under
7	subparagraph (D), a description of the purposes of, and dif-
8	ferences between—
9	"(i) the report required under paragraph (1)(F);
10	and
11	"(ii) the Campus Hazing Transparency Report
12	required under this paragraph.
13	"(F) For purposes of this paragraph, the definition of
14	'campus' under paragraph (6)(A)(ii) shall not apply.
15	"(G) An institution described in subparagraph (A) is
16	not required to—
17	"(i) develop the Campus Hazing Transparency
18	Report under this subsection until such institution
19	has a finding of a hazing violation; or
20	"(ii) update the Campus Hazing Transparency
21	Report in accordance with clause (iii) of subpara-
22	graph (A) for a period described in such clause if
23	such institution does not have a finding of a hazing
24	violation for such period.".

1 SEC. 4. JEANNE CLERY CAMPUS SAFETY ACT.

- 2 Paragraph (19) of section 485(f) of the Higher Edu-
- 3 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1092(f)(19)), as so redesig-
- 4 nated, is amended by striking "Jeanne Clery Disclosure of
- 5 Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act"
- 6 and inserting "Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act".

7 SEC. 5. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.

- 8 Nothing in this Act, or an amendment made by this
- 9 Act, shall be construed to affect the rights (including rem-
- 10 edies and procedures) available to persons under the First
- 11 Amendment of the Constitution of the United States or
- 12 rights to due process.
