The TWSE Promotes Financial Education in Junior High Schools, Receives Enthusiastic Response and Praise

To deepen financial knowledge in schools and establish a solid foundation, the TWSE compiled a financial education lesson plan suitable for junior high school students for the first time last year (2023). This lesson plan, intended as a teaching aid for teachers, received enthusiastic feedback from junior high school teachers across Taiwan. In the first semester of the 2023 academic year, junior high schools in 13 counties and cities across Taiwan implemented the lesson plan, achieving an overall satisfaction rate of 97.7% for teaching activities using the plan, with a 100% recommendation rate for its use. To continue promoting the junior high school lesson plan, the TWSE is holding an online training camp for seed teachers from now until August 31, 2024, and will continue to implement reward activities for teachers using the lesson plan.

The junior high school lesson plan aims to impart basic concepts of investment and financial management, focusing on the "securities market." The course is divided into five units: "Consumption and Savings," "Introduction to the Securities Market and Financial Investment Tools," "Stocks and Funds," "Regular and Small Investments, Risk and Return of Financial Tools," and "Financial Fraud Prevention." The TWSE established a lesson plan compilation team that spent a year and a half working with junior high school teachers to repeatedly draft and adjust the lesson plan, designing learning language suitable for junior high school students and appropriate financial education materials.

This year (2024), the TWSE is building on this success by launching a "High School Financial Management Lesson Plan." From July to August, physical training camps for seed teachers will be held in Taipei, Taichung, and Kaohsiung. To encourage teachers to use the lesson plan, a reward activity for implementing the plan is being launched simultaneously. Spaces are limited, so teachers are encouraged to register as soon as possible.
