INTERCONNECTED VOIP NUMBERING AUTHORIZATION APPLICATION OF RGTN USA, INC. GRANTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 52.15(g) OF THE COMMISSION'S RULES

WC Docket No. 23-335

By this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) grants an application filed by RGTN USA, Inc., (RGTN), pursuant to section 52.15(g)(3) of the Commission's rules, seeking authorization to obtain North American Numbering Plan telephone numbers directly from the Numbering Administrator.¹

Due to the foreign ownership of the Applicant, the Bureau initially determined that further review was required to evaluate whether granting the Application served the public interest, and therefore established a non-streamlined pleading cycle.² The Bureau referred the Application on December 15, 2023, to the relevant Executive Branch agencies for their views on any national security, law enforcement, foreign policy, or trade policy concerns related to the foreign ownership of the Applicant.³ On January 2, 2024, the Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Services Sector (Committee) notified the Commission that it was reviewing the Application for any national security and law enforcement concerns that may be raised by the foreign

ownership and requested that the Commission defer action on the Application.⁴ As requested, we deferred action on the Application.⁵

On March 21, 2024, the Committee notified the Commission that the Applicant had provided complete responses to initial questions posed by the Committee and that the Committee was conducting an initial 120-day review to assess whether grant of the Application would pose a risk to the national security or law enforcement interests of the United States.⁶ On June 27, 2024, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration, on behalf of the Committee, filed a letter stating that the Committee has reviewed the Application and "has no recommendation at this time to the Commission approving the [A]pplication and no objection to the Commission granting it."⁷

The Bureau now has concluded its review and has determined that the Application raises no public interest concerns warranting further consideration at this time, and hereby grants RGTN's Application for direct access to numbering resources.
