WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU ANNOUNCES POSTING OF 2024 TARIFF REVIEW PLAN FOR EXOGENOUS COST FILINGS BY RATE-OF-RETURN CARRIERS THAT ELECTED INCENTIVE REGULATION FOR BUSINESS DATA SERVICES

By this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) announces the release of the 2024 tariff review plan (TRP) workbooks for rate-of-return local exchange carriers that elected incentive regulation for their business data services (BDS) offerings pursuant to the *Rate-of-Return BDS Order* and *Enhanced A-CAM Order* to calculate exogenous cost adjustments to their tariffed BDS rates. This year, the Bureau established November 1, 2024 as the effective date for tariff filings implementing these exogenous cost adjustments. The TRP workbooks are posted on the Commission's website at: https://www.fcc.gov/2024-2025-trp-midcourse-exogenous-cost-filings.

In the 2024 Tariff Review Plan Order, the Bureau required rate-of-return carriers that elected BDS incentive regulation to file TRP workbooks reflecting any exogenous cost adjustment for Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS), North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA), and regulatory fees in rates to be effective October 1, 2024.³ On September 9, 2024, the Bureau extended the effective date for the exogenous cost tariff filing from October 1 to November 1, 2024.⁴ The exogenous cost adjustment for TRS must be "grossed up" to spread the entire adjustment over the remaining eight months in the tariff year. The exogenous cost adjustment for regulatory fees and NANPA fees must be "grossed up" to spread the entire adjustments over the remaining 11 months between November 1, 2024 and September 30, 2025.⁵ The TRP workbooks adjust BDS rates using

factors for the TRS contribution fees,⁶ NANPA contribution fee,⁷ and the regulatory fee for interstate telecommunications service providers.⁸ For exogenous cost tariff filings to be effective November 1, 2024, tariff filings made on 15 days' notice are due on October 17, 2024 and tariff filings made on 7 days' notice are due on October 25, 2024.⁹

The TRP workbooks posted on the Commission's website were prepared by the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) for carriers for which NECA files BDS rates and is designed to ensure that carriers make exogenous cost and rate adjustments in accordance with the Commission's rules. ¹⁰ Carriers that do not participate in the NECA tariff should also file a TRP workbook. ¹¹ Commission staff reviewed the TRPs released today and carriers are encouraged to use them. Carriers are free, however, to create and submit their own TRP workbooks, as long as those TRP workbooks comply with the Commission's rules. Carriers should submit their TRP workbooks, data, and formulas in an Excel format rather than PDF format. ¹²

Consistent with the 2024 Tariff Review Plan Order, the November 1, 2024 exogenous cost filing and rate adjustment is optional if the total amount of such adjustments would either increase rates or meet a *de minimis* threshold equal to the \$1,040 standard tariff filing fee applied on the same basis as the tariff filing for which the filing fee is paid.¹³ Per the *Extension Order*, carriers may treat the exogenous cost tariff filing as a tariff transmittal amending their federal universal service (FUSF) contribution factor tariff filing effective October 1, 2024.¹⁴ In their transmittal letter, carriers should refer to the original tariff transmittal number in order to avoid an additional tariff filing fee. If a carrier did not submit the October 1, 2024 FUSF contribution factor tariff filing and submits the November 1, 2024 exogenous cost tariff filing, it must submit the standard tariff filing fee through the Commission's Registration System (CORES).¹⁵
