Kansas Commissioner Dwight D. Keen and Mississippi Chairman Chris Brown Appointed to NARUC Board of Directors

WASHINGTON (December 8, 2024) — National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners President Tricia Pridemore has appointed Commissioner Dwight D. Keen, of the Kansas Corporation Commission, and Chairman Chris Brown, of the Mississippi Public Service Commission, to the Association’s Board of Directors.

Keen has served as a commissioner since 2018 and is a member of NARUC’s Committee on Gas, Subcommittee on Pipeline Safety and the Subcommittee on Clean Coal and Carbon Management. He is also a member of the NARUC Gas-Electric Alignment for Reliability Working Group. His government experience includes serving for six years as a Kansas securities commissioner

Brown previously served in the Mississippi state legislature since 2012 and is the founder of several businesses.

“I am truly honored by the opportunity to serve on the NARUC Board of Directors and thereby participate in advancing the important public service missions of NARUC,” said Keen.

The Board consists of 20 members, plus the Association’s president, the first and second vice presidents, and each past president who is still an active NARUC member. As the supervisory body, the Board oversees the Association’s general and financial functions and approves resolutions that serve as the Association’s policy.
