## Public Hearing October 3 for 5.0 MW Solar Plant Proposed for Kent County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are invited to comment on a proposal by TPE MD KE51, LLC to construct a 5.0 MW solar facility in Kent County. The virtual hearing will take place on **Thursday, October 3, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.** before Chief Public Utility Law Judge Chuck McLean.

In May 2024, TPE MD KE51 applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station or high-voltage transmission line in Maryland. According to the application, the solar facility, intended as part of Maryland's community solar program, would be built on approximately 40 acres of a 199-acre property located at 10066 Peacock Corner Road in Millington.

The hearing will include a presentation by the developer, followed by brief statements from the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Maryland Office of People's Counsel, and the Commission's Technical Staff, and then an opportunity for members of the public to comment on the proposed project.
