## Public Hearing September 25 for 2.25 MW Solar Plant Proposed for Carroll County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are invited to comment on a proposal by Spring Valley Solar 1, LLC to construct a 2.25 MW solar facility in Carroll County. The virtual hearing will take place on **Wednesday, September 25, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.** before Chief Public Utility Law Judge Chuck McLean.

In April 2024, Spring Valley Solar applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station or high-voltage transmission line in Maryland. According to the application, the solar facility, intended as part of Maryland's community solar program, would be built on 14 acres of an 80-acre property located at 1500 Fannie Dorsey Road in Sykesville.

The hearing will include a presentation by the developer, followed by brief statements from the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Maryland Office of People's Counsel, and the Commission's Technical Staff, and then an opportunity for members of the public to comment on the proposed project.
