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Public Comment Hearings Scheduled For Columbia Gas of Maryland Rate Case

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(BALTIMORE, MD) – The Maryland Public Service Commission will hold two public comment hearings on the request by Columbia Gas of Maryland to increase rates by \$8.7 million. Columbia Gas of Maryland, a subsidiary of NiSource, Inc., provides retail gas distribution service to approximately 34,000 customers in the western Maryland counties of Allegany, Garrett and Washington. According to the company, under its proposed rates the total monthly bill for an average residential customer would increase from \$94.19 per month to \$108.28 per month, or by nearly 15%.
