**SETTLEMENT ORDER** 

Based on an investigation conducted by the Bureau of Insurance ("Bureau"), the Bureau

alleges that Justin R. Chaine ("Defendant"), duly licensed by the State Corporation Commission

("Commission") to transact the business of insurance in the Commonwealth of Virginia, violated

§ 38.2-1831 (1) of the Code of Virginia ("Code") by providing materially incorrect, misleading,

incomplete or untrue information in the license application or any other document filed with the

Commission.

The Commission is authorized by §§ 38.2-218, 38.2-219, 38.2-1831 and 38.2-1832 of the

Code to impose certain monetary penalties, issue cease and desist orders, and suspend or revoke

a defendant's license upon a finding by the Commission, after notice and opportunity to be heard,

that a defendant has committed the aforesaid alleged violation.

The Defendant has been advised of the right to a hearing in this matter whereupon the

Defendant, without admitting nor denying any violation of Virginia law, has made an offer of

settlement to the Commission. In settlement, the Defendant has tendered to the Treasurer of

Virginia the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) and has waived the right to a hearing.

The Bureau has recommended that the Commission accept the Defendant's settlement

offer pursuant to the authority granted the Commission in § 12.1-15 of the Code.

NOW THE COMMISSION, having considered this matter, is of the opinion and finds that the Defendant's settlement offer should be accepted.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- (1) The Defendant's settlement offer is hereby accepted.
- (2) This case is dismissed.
