SETTLEMENT ORDER

Based on an investigation conducted by the Bureau of Insurance ("Bureau"), the Bureau alleges that Caryle Taylor Poindexter ("Defendant"), duly licensed by the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") to transact the business of insurance in the Commonwealth of Virginia, violated § 38.2-1826 B of the Code of Virginia ("Code") by failing to report to the Commission within 30 calendar days the facts and circumstances regarding a felony conviction; and § 38.2-1826 C of the Code by failing to report to the Commission within 30 calendar days of the final disposition of the matter any administrative action taken against the Defendant in another jurisdiction.

The Defendant is a Puerto Rico resident licensed with the following line of authority:
Property & Casualty.

The Commission is authorized by §§ 38.2-218, 38.2-219, 38.2-1831 and 38.2-1832 of the Code to impose certain monetary penalties, issue cease and desist orders, and suspend or revoke a defendant's license upon a finding by the Commission, after notice and opportunity to be heard, that a defendant has committed the aforesaid alleged violations.

The Defendant has been advised of the right to a hearing in this matter whereupon the Defendant, without admitting nor denying any violation of Virginia law, has made an offer of

settlement to the Commission. In settlement, the Defendant has waived the right to a hearing; has voluntarily surrendered the authority to act as an insurance agent in Virginia effective August 26, 2024; and has agreed not to make any application to transact the business of insurance in Virginia for a period of five (5) years from August 26, 2024.

The Bureau has recommended that the Commission accept the Defendant's settlement offer pursuant to the authority granted the Commission in § 12.1-15 of the Code.

NOW THE COMMISSION, having considered this matter, is of the opinion and finds that the Defendant's settlement offer should be accepted.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- (1) The Defendant's settlement offer is hereby accepted; and
- (2) This case is dismissed.
