For approval to amend certificates of public convenience and necessity for the Brunswick and Greensville County Power Stations to construct and operate an LNG Storage Facility pursuant to § 56-580 D of the Code of Virginia

ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION

On June 4, 2024, Virginia Electric and Power Company filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") its application ("Application") to amend the certificates of public convenience and necessity for the Brunswick County Power Station and the Greensville County Power Station to construct and operate a liquified natural gas production, storage, and regasification facility and related transmission facilities adjacent to the Greensville County Power Station, pursuant to § 56-580 D of the Code of Virginia and the Commission's Filing Requirements in Support of Applications for Authority to Construct and Operate an Electric Generating Facility, 20 VAC 5-302-10 *et seq.*¹

On July 9, 2024, the Commission entered an Order for Notice and Hearing in this proceeding that, among other things, provided that each respondent in this proceeding may file testimony and exhibits on or before October 1, 2024.

On October 2, 2024, the Office of the Attorney General's Division of Consumer Counsel ("Consumer Counsel") filed a Motion for Extension ("Motion") concurrently with the Direct Testimony and Exhibits of Scott Norwood. In its Motion, Consumer Counsel requests the Commission accept the Direct Testimony and Exhibits of Scott Norwood for filing one day out

of time.² In support of this request, Consumer Counsel states that it experienced unanticipated staffing issues which caused the delay in filing, and that the Motion is unopposed by all case participants.³

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of this matter, is of the opinion and finds that Consumer Counsel's Motion should be granted, and that the Direct Testimony and Exhibits of Scott Norwood should be accepted as filed one day out of time on October 2, 2024.

Accordingly, IT IS SO ORDERED, and this matter is CONTINUED.
