## **HEARING EXAMINER'S RULING**

## **November 18, 2024**

On June 4, 2024, Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy Virginia ("Dominion" or "Company") filed an Application with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") to amend certificates of public convenience and necessity for the Brunswick County Power Station and the Greensville County Power Station to construct and operate a liquified natural gas production, storage, and regasification facility and related transmission facilities adjacent to the Greensville County Power Station.

On July 9, 2024, the Commission entered its Order for Notice and Hearing ("Procedural Order") in this case. The Procedural Order, among other things, established a procedural schedule that includes a public hearing and appointed a Hearing Examiner to rule on all discovery matters and *pro hac vice* motions in this proceeding.

On September 3, 2024, Appalachian Voices filed a notice of participation in Case No. PUR-2024-00096. On November 13, 2024, Appalachian Voices filed a Motion for Admission *Pro Hac Vice* of Emma Clancy ("Motion"). Counsel for Appalachian Voices, E. Grayson Holmes, Esquire, of the Southern Environmental Law Center, a member of the Virginia State Bar, moved the admission *pro hac vice* of Emma Clancy, Esquire, to practice before the Commission in Case No. PUR-2024-00096. Mr. Holmes stated Ms. Clancy is a member in good standing of the South Carolina and New York Bars. Mr. Holmes further represented, among other things, that Ms. Clancy will abide by the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure and will conduct herself as other attorneys admitted to practice before the Commission.

Appalachian Voices' Motion is hereby granted. Accordingly,

**IT IS DIRECTED THAT** Emma Clancy, Esquire, is admitted *pro hac vice* in the instant proceeding.
