The following is a summary of the terms of the notes offered by the preliminary pricing supplement hyperlinked below.

Index Overview

The J.P. Morgan Total Return Index (the "Index") seeks to provide a dynamic asset allocation to the U.S. dollar fixed income sector based on a momentum allocation strategy. The Index tracks the return of a notional dynamic portfolio consisting of up to 12 U.S. dollar fixed-income exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") (each a "Constituent," and collectively, the "Constituents"), in each case with distributions, if any, notionally reinvested.

Payment At Maturity: At maturity you will receive a cash payment, for each \$1,000 principal amount note, calculated as follows:

$$\$1,000 \times (1 + \text{Index Return}) \times \text{Index Adjustment Factor}$$

Assuming an Index Adjustment Factor of 100.00%, the Index Adjustment Factor will not provide any buffer against any decline of the Index. If the Final Value is less than the Initial Value, you will lose some or all of your principal amount at maturity.

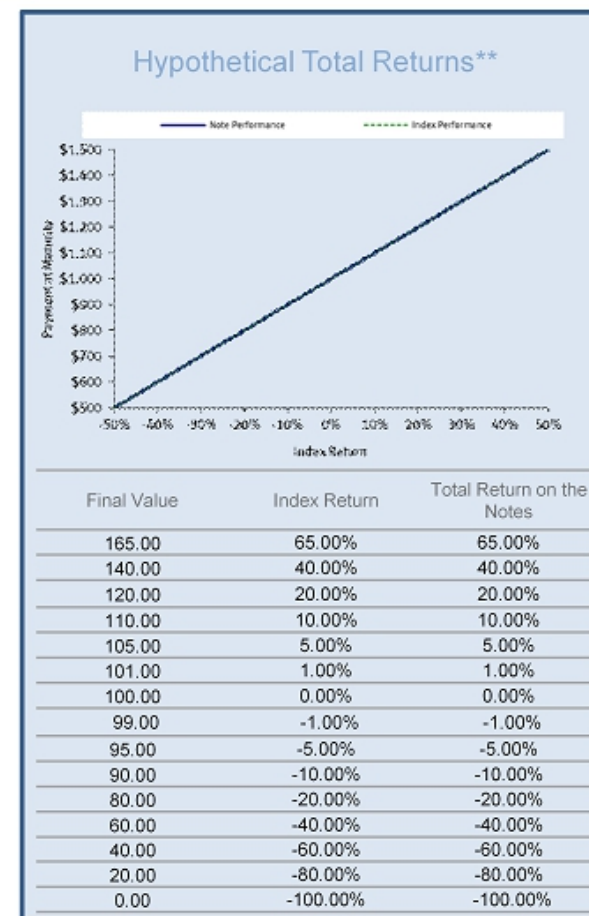
