

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Alabama has developed essential guidelines to support and promote consistent school attendance among K-12 students and their families; and

WHEREAS, excellent school and classroom attendance is key to K-12 student success and lifelong achievement; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence is defined as missing 18 or more days of school for any reason, including excused and unexcused absences, or just two or three days a month, which has become in some cases a predictor of possible academic trouble; and

WHEREAS, improving school attendance and reducing classroom chronic absences requires commitment, collaboration and a tailored approach from our local communities; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence exacerbates achievement and lowers student learning and the positive outcomes achieved from an excellent education; and

WHEREAS, absenteeism also undermines efforts to strengthen local schools; and

WHEREAS, our statewide educational efforts continue to improve the reading skills of all students through early literacy success and work to ensure our K-12 students are building the skills required to read at and above grade level; and

WHEREAS, our efforts are also enriching the overall learning experiences for all K-12 students through effective academic support; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence is reduced when local schools, parents and community residents work together to encourage excellent school attendance; and

WHEREAS, these efforts help to address potential barriers, which could keep students from excelling in the classroom or their future careers as adults;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim September 2024, as
