Proclamation

WHEREAS; encompassing a wide range of topics and disciplines, the arts encourage collaborative, intergenerational, and multicultural learning and enable individual expression through a variety of different media; and

WHEREAS; arts education empowers students to develop their critical thinking, form problem-solving skills, grow their imagination and creativity, practice discipline, and discover alternative ways to communicate and express ideas, which supports academic success and personal growth outside the classroom; and

WHEREAS; according to the United States Bureau of Economic Analysis and National Endowment for the Arts, the Wisconsin arts and culture sector contributed \$11.9 billion to the state's economy in 2022 and provided more than 89,000 jobs; and

WHEREAS; to help Wisconsin's youth to succeed, schools, communities, and arts education nonprofit organizations deliver high-quality learning opportunities, and those programs are in need of continued support and investment; and

WHEREAS; by making arts education and art accessible, Wisconsin aims to enrich cultural experiences, foster creativity, and fuel economic prosperity across the state; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins the thousands of organizations and individuals across the state dedicated to supporting the arts in education, promoting thoughtful engagement with history, culture, and ideas, and encouraging all Wisconsinites to find their own creative voice;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim September 8 – 14, 2024, as

WISCONSIN ARTS IN EDUCATION WEEK

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
