About the Selection Process

The appointment of Ms. Mack comes after a rigorous national search that began in March 2024. The process attracted over 100 applicants and included community input sessions, bilingual surveys, and feedback from various stakeholders to ensure that the selection reflected the values and aspirations of El Paso's residents.

The decision was made following a series of four community Meet and Greet events, where residents had the opportunity to interact directly with each of the finalists for the position. In addition, two Council-appointed community panels, provided critical input that helped shape the final decision.
