In order to provide the Congress with as much information as possible, the attached table summarizes information about the estimated direct spending and revenue effects of some of the legislation that has been ordered reported by the **Senate Committee on Indian Affairs** during the 118th Congress. The legislation listed in this table generally would have small effects, if any, on direct spending or revenues, CBO estimates. Where possible, the table also provides information about the legislation's estimated effects on spending subject to appropriation and on intergovernmental and private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

S. 4365 would authorize the Secretary of Health and Human Services, acting through the Indian Health Service (IHS), to expend funds for public health veterinary services to prevent and control zoonotic disease infection and transmission in IHS service areas where the risk for disease occurrence in humans and wildlife is endemic. CBO estimates that enacting S. 4365 would not affect direct spending or revenues. CBO has not estimated the bill's effects on spending subject to appropriation. The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

S. 4370 would amend the Tribal Forest Protection Act of 2024, which authorizes the Departments of Agriculture and the Interior to enter into contracts and agreements with Indian tribes to carry out projects proposed by tribes on land owned by the Forest Service or Bureau of Land Management. The bill also would make additional tribal and Alaska Native land eligible for the program. S. 4370 would authorize the appropriation of \$15 million for each fiscal year over the 2025-2030 period. CBO estimates that enacting S. 4370 would not affect direct spending or revenues. CBO estimates that implementing the bill would cost \$68 million over the 2025-2029 period, assuming appropriation of the authorized amounts. The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act
