We were also pleased to deliver a range of different events, including presenting to university student groups, hosting networking events, conducting panel discussions

and sponsoring innovation seminars and industry awards nights. We look forward to delivering a broader program of events and initiatives in 2024.

.au registrars play an equally important role in our stakeholder community, delivering .au registration services to members of the public. During Q2, we brought registrars together at the annual .au Registrar Summit. It provided a platform for information sharing between auDA, the au registry operator and registrars, and an opportunity to hear from expert guest speakers. I thank all those who joined us, and registrars for their shared commitment to maintaining a secure and trusted .au domain.

Over the quarter, we also sought feedback from the public on minor amendments to .au Licensing Rules. The proposed changes sought to enhance the operation

of the Rules by providing clarification and minor updates to processes. We thank those who participated in the consultation. The outcome of the consultation and updated Rules are now available on the auDA website.

One of auDA's core functions is to advocate for and actively participate in the multi-stakeholder model of **internet governance**. In Q2, we attended the global Internet Governance Forum (IGF) and 78th meeting of the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN78). At these forums, the auDA team had the opportunity to present on auDA's **Internet Governance Roadmap**, which sets out recommendations to sustain multi-stakeholder internet governance and contribute to panel discussions on topics such as addressing internet fragmentation and domain name system (DNS) abuse.

We're always pleased when we're invited to speak on areas related to our expertise, and DNS abuse is an area we're particularly passionate about. We take pride in administering one of the most secure domains in the world with low levels of DNS abuse. Our dedicated Compliance Team takes seriously its role rectifying any instances that do emerge and, in the quarter, it completed 461 DNS abuse audits, up 48 per cent year-on-year.

As set out in our 2021–25 Strategy, auDA is committed to producing leading insights that support Australians online. In November we were thrilled to release our latest **Digital Lives of Australians 2023: Readiness for emerging technologies report** and in December we released the **Digital Atlas of Australia Online 2023**report, the latter of which was developed in partnership with CSIRO's Data61 and the University of Technology Sydney. These reports provide insights on the Australian

internet ecosystem and are recommended reading for policymakers, academics and industry leaders. We welcome any feedback on them.

In Q2, we announced changes to the **auDA Board**. We farewelled Directors Matt Healy and Jackie Korhonen, and welcomed two new Appointed Directors, Tara Commerford and Thu-Trang Tran. We also invited our members to vote to elect an Elected Director to the Board. At our November AGM, we announced the result of the ballot, and the return of Peter Elford to the Board for another term. I thank our departing Directors for their expertise and contributions during their terms and look forward to working with our Elected Director and new Appointed Directors over their time on the auDA Board.

As we enter a new calendar year, I look forward to continuing to work closely with auDA's multi-stakeholder community to advance our work supporting .au and an open, free, secure and global internet that benefits all Australians.




