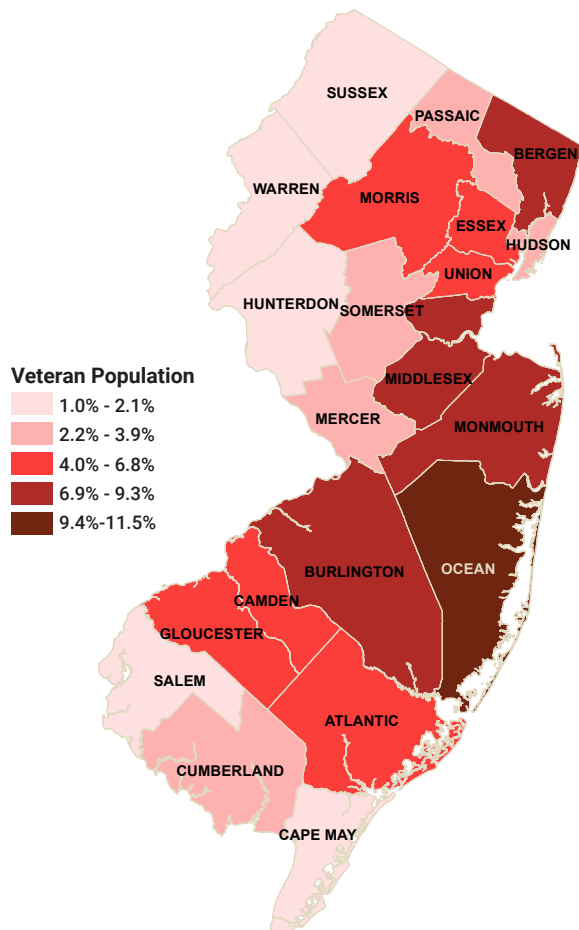
Celebrating New Jersey's Veterans

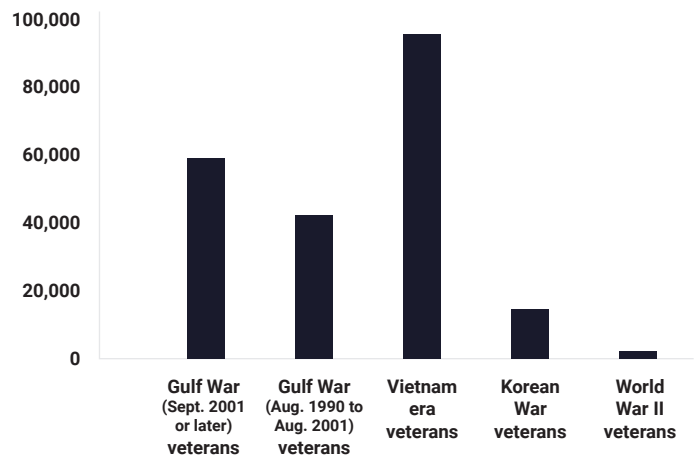


In this edition of the Labor Market Spotlight, we proudly honor the 258,500 veterans who have chosen the Garden State as their home and extend our deepest gratitude to these brave individuals. About 20% reside in Burlington and Ocean counties, likely due to the presence of Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. We pay special tribute to the 1% of New Jersey's veterans who are among the surviving World War II heroes. Additionally, we recognize the rich diversity within our veteran community, with 11.5% being Hispanic and 7.4% being women. We are deeply thankful for their service and the vibrant contributions they bring to our state.

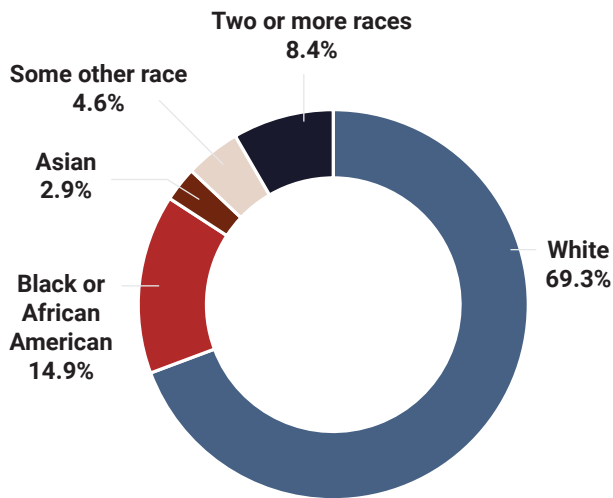

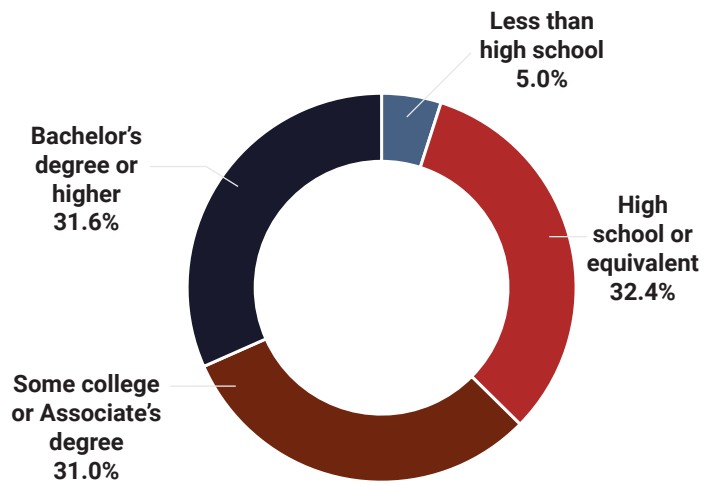

Veterans by Race¹



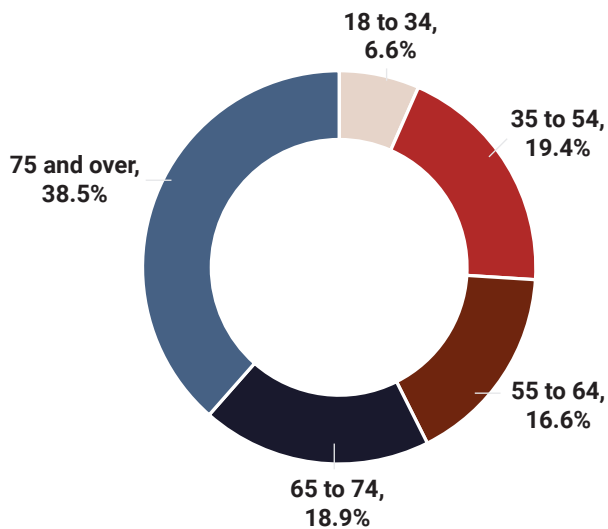
31% of New Jersey's veterans are non-White.
